Minutes of the August 13, 2019 AHCA Meeting were approved.

Eileen Janas reported on the Neighborhood Conservation Advisory Committee (NCAC) activities. Construction of the improved walking/biking path along Arlington Blvd. has begun. Construction is expected to be completed in 2019 with tree planting to occur in the spring 2020. County construction manager is Charles Boateng, 703-859-0147. The construction crew is coordinating with Etz Hayim staff to keep them informed of activities.

Attendees validated the priority projects for the NCAC: Traffic calming on First Road South and Sidewalk improvements on Second St. S in front of Thomas Jefferson Community Center.

Habte Michael reported that the guidelines to direct guest traffic away from Highland St. at the Ethiopian Community Development Council are working well. He has not had complaints from the neighbors. Neighbors are invited to the November 24 Refugees' First Thanksgiving Dinner. Flyers with details were provided.

David Priddy (AHCA rep to BLPC) reported that the Career Center Building Level Planning Committee (BLPC) has had four meetings to date and encouraged people to review materials on the website: <u>https://www.apsva.us/design-and-</u> <u>construction/arlington-career-center/</u> There was discussion about parking on- and offsite: ensure there is adequate bike parking since bike racks are often insufficient; Fleet is having trouble getting substitute teachers because there are no parking provisions for them; pay the money for the parking garage particularly because many of our streets are so narrow that they become one lane roads when cars are parked on both sides; there is plenty of on-street parking and we should not spend so much on a garage. Kristi Sawert reported that there had been a parking study done during the summer. Peak demand is expected to be 500-600 spaces.

Carole Lieber represents AHCA on the Public Art for Columbia Pike Transit Shelters, Community Technical Advisory Panel. There will be art work on the top of the shelters.

Nick Carrasco, 1st Vice President, reported that the yahoo list serve has been migrated to groups.io, at a cost of \$220 per year.

Jay Vennett reported that the holiday party is scheduled for Dec 13 with caroling at 6:00 PM and refreshments at Mike and Meade Hanna's house at 7:00 PM.

Kristi Sawert was informed of a VDOT meeting about the intersection of S. Irving and Rt 50.

There was discussion about the Purple Lounge use permit review. The establishment has had different names. A motion was passed that AHCA considers the Purple Lounge, it's owners and successor tenants, to be a public nuisance and opposes the use permit renewal.

On Monday, Nov. 18, 2019, 7-8:00 PM there will be a joint Arlington Public Schools/Arlington County meeting at the Columbia Pike Library to inform the neighborhood of the changes to the library to accommodate students at the Career Center.
